In 1965 the informally known to as the "Leadville Petrified Forest" was renamed in honor of George W. Lund. In 1951, Lund had witnessed the blasting of the "Leadville" trees by uranium prospectors and was infuriated as he watched bulldozers and steam shovels load tons of petrified wood onto trucks for commercial exploitation. Today all that is really left is the two caged specimens. Inside the fenced area the rest of the specimens have been taken away by illegal collectors. Anything outside the fence is collectable - if you can find some.
