The Nightingale Mining District, especially the east complex, is one of the most shaft & hole riddled places in Northwest Nevada. The area usually approached by most explorers is but a sample of what can be found all over the area. An entire day can be spent and not see it all.

This Map Book covers areas to the north of the most visited place in the Nightingale range.





The starting point is the most visited area of the Nightingale District. The rock environment can be extremely hazardous to the unprepared.

Getting to this area via Coyote Canyon is covered in the NIGHTINGALE EAST Map Book. An alternative route from RT80 is also available in the NIGHTINGALE EAST ALTERNATIVE Map Book


