

# TREKKING BLACK ROCK NIGHTINGALE EAST



NOTE: Some SUVs may have problems traversing Coyote Canyon due to Spring rains and washes. An alternative route is presented in the second half of this MapBook.



As can be seen there are three roads leading to the Nightingale Mining District from Nixon. All three are on Paiute Lands so a permit is required, to a point.

The easiest access is at point A, which is where we usually begin.
