


TREKKING 2016

STONE ARCH





The STONE ARCH is a natural rock formation in the Nighingale Mountain Range foothills. It is an interesting side trek to those heading to the eastern side of the Nightingale Mining District.

Marble Bluff

Start out on Rt447 in Nixon and take the route north as if heading for the Eastern Nightingale Mining District.

Coyote Canyon

Solid line goes to the Nightingale District on the East side of the Nightingale Mountains. The STONE ARCH is on the way on the left.

From the Dead End Parking Place it is about a quarter mile hike, if that, up hill to the Arch.
